AN ACT

REQUIRING CLERKS OF THE DISTRICT COURT TO GIVE BOND.

Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of Colorado Territory :

SECTION 1. That the Clerks of the District Court of this Territory be, and they are hereby required to execute a bond to the people of the Territory of Colorado, in the penal sum of five thousand dollars each, to be approved by the judges of their respective districts, conditioned for the faithful performance of their duties as clerk of said court, and that they will punctually pay over to the person legally authorized to receive the same, all monies that may come into their hands by virtue of the said office.

Clerks of the District Courts must execute bond.

SEC. 2. The bonds so executed by said clerks may be sued upon in the name of the people to the use of any person or persons injured by their breach, in any court of competent jurisdiction.

Approved August 15th, 1862.

AN ACT

CONCERNING OFFICIAL BONDS OF MASTERS AND RECEIVERS IN CHANCERY.

Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of Colorado Territory :

SECTION 1. All bonds required by law, or the courts of equity, to be executed by masters or receivers in chancery, shall be executed to "The People of the Territory of Colorado," as obligee, and may be prosecuted by any person or persons in the name of the People of the Territory, for the use of the person aggrieved.

Masters' and receivers' bonds to run in the name of the People of Colorado.

Approved July 30th, 1862.

AN ACT

AMENDATORY OF AN ACT CONCERNING CLERKS OF COURTS.

Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of Colorado Territory :

SECTION 1. That the words in the first section of said act, "except the county in which said (clerk) shall reside" be, and the same are hereby stricken from said section.

Clerk may appoint deputy.

Approved Aug. 15th, 1862.
