AN ACT

AUTHORIZING THE DISMISSAL OF CAUSES IN VACATION.

Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of Colorado Territory:

SECTION 1. Any party plaintiff to a cause in any of the courts in this Territory, may at any time, either in term time or vacation, file with the clerk of the court in which said suit is pending, a written order for the dismissal of said cause, signed by the said plaintiff, or by the attorney of record in the cause; and the clerk of said court shall thereupon enter an order of dismissal on the records, and may at once issue a fee bill for the collection of the costs in said case, against the said party plaintiff, and the said cause, upon said order of dismissal being filed, shall no longer be considered as pen[d]ing in said court.
