A N A C T

AUTHORIZING THE GAME AND FISH COMMISSION TO
LEASE PROPERTY OR LANDS.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Commission
Authorized to
Lease Property
or Lands

Section 1. The Game and Fish Commission is hereby authorized, according to the provisions of the law, to rent or lease any property or lands, which, by circumstances, are now or may become surplus, or which, in the proper management of the Game and Fish Department of the State of Colorado, may be deemed as desirable for rent or lease by the Game and Fish Commission. Provided, however, that the lease shall contain the right of ingress and egress to all sportsmen holding valid licenses—It shall also protect the surface rights of said property.

Funds Deposited
in Game
Cash Fund

Section 2. All funds derived from said rentals or leases shall be deposited in the Game Cash Fund.

Repealing
Clause

Section 3. All acts and parts of acts in conflict with this Act are hereby repealed.

Safety Clause

Section 4. The General Assembly hereby finds, determines and declares that this Act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety.
