CHAPTER 20.

APPROPRIATION.

CHARLES S. COOPER.

(H. B. No. 427, by Mr. Slawson.)

AN ACT

APPROPRIATING MONEY TO PAY CHARLES S. COOPER FOR
MONEY PAID FOR CLERK HIRE IN OFFICE OF STATE
BOARD OF LAND COMMISSIONERS.

Be it Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Appropriation.

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of nine hundred dollars (\$900) to pay Charles S. Cooper for money advanced to pay for Clerk hire in State Land Office from May 1, 1897 to February 1, 1899.

Clerk hire.

Emergency.

Sec. 2. In the opinion of the General Assembly an emergency exists; therefore, this act shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage.

Approved April 13, 1903.
