AN ACT

To amend an act entitled "An act providing for the SUPPORT OF PAUPERS," APPROVED FEBRUARY 10TH. A. D.

Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of Colorado Territory:

Section 1. At the end of section three of said act. add the following: "Provided, That upon the clerk Proviso of the board of county commissioners of any county, counties are furnishing a certificate of one or more doctors of reimbursed medicine, that any such poor person or pauper is, keeping in-and has been during the time such pauper may have pers. been a county charge, insane or lunatic, together with a certificate of the county treasurer of the amount which may have been paid out of such county treasury on account of such insane person or lunatic, to the territorial auditor, who shall thereupon audit the same and draw a warrant upon the territorial treasurer for the amount so expended, in favor of the county treasurer of the proper county, and the territorial treasurer shall pay the same out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated; the money so paid by the territorial treasurer shall be placed with the general funds of such county, and again expended as other funds belonging to such county.

SEC. 2. This act to take effect and be in full force

from and after its passage.

AN ACT

Amendatory of "An act providing for the Collection of THE REVENUE," APPROVED NOVEMBER 7TH, 1861.

Re it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of Colorado Territory:

Section 1. That all buildings in the several coun-nutdings to ties of this territory, occupying land the title to be regarded which still remains in the government of the United tate. States, shall hereafter be regarded as real estate, and shall be considered as such in all courts of law and equity of this territory.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

AN ACT

IN RELATION TO TERRITORIAL ROADS.

. Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of Colorado Territory:

Who may loroads.

Section 1. The county commissioners in their recate county spective counties, shall have authority to survey and locate territorial roads, and the roads so surveyed and located shall stand in lieu of roads heretofore declared as territorial roads: Provided, That the line or direction of such roads shall not be materially changed in their location, further than to straighten or locate them on better or more suitable ground.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force

from and after its passage.

AN ACT

TO LEGALIZE THE ACTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMIS-SIGNERS OF ARAPANCE COUNTY, IN RELATION TO A CERTAIN

Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of Colorado Territory:

Description of road.

Section 1. That the survey of a road as made and authorized by the board of commissioners of Arapahoe county, running from the city of Denver on an air line through the county of Arapahoe, to the' south line of Weld county, be and is hereby declared a territorial road.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
