titled to the name of Frank Crampton Hoyt, and by that name shall be known and called.

SEC. 2. That the said Frank Crampton Hoyt shall be entitled to and inherit the same interest in the estate, real and personal, of the said Samuel N. Hoyt, in the same manner as if he was the son and natural heir of the said Samuel N. Hoyt.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

An act to change the Name of Sarah Thomas.

*Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of Colorado Territory:*

SECTION 1. That the name of Sarah Thomas, of the city of Denver, county of Arapahoe, and territory of Colorado, is hereby changed to that of Sarah Burton, by which name she shall hereafter be known in law and equity.

SEC. 2. This act to take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

An act to change the Name of Anna Martin, and make her Heir at Law of Wilson C. Hess.

*Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of Colorado Territory:*

SECTION 1. That the name of Anna Martin, of Arapahoe county, Colorado territory, shall hereafter be known by the name of Anna Marisco Hess, and by that name shall be known and called.

SEC. 2. That the said Anna Marisco Hess shall be entitled to inherit the same interest in the estate, real and personal, of the said Wilson C. Hess, in the same manner as if she were the daughter and natural heir of the said Wilson C. Hess.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
