An act to provide for the relocation of the County-seat of Clear Creek County, Colorado.

Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of Colorado Territory:

SEC. 1. That at the next general election in Clear Creek county for county and other officers, the question shall be submitted to the legal voters of said county whether they desire to relocate the county-seat of said county.

SEC. 2. The legal voters of said county at said election, may designate on their ballots, the name of any place in said county which they desire to be the county-seat of said Clear Creek

county.

SEC. 3. When the votes are canvassed, the place having a majority of all the votes polled, shall be the county seat of said Clear Creek county, and public notice of such location shall be given within thirty days by the county commissioners by posting up notices in three different places in the county.

SEC. 4. If, at said election, no place shall receive a majority of all the votes polled at said election, the said county-seat shall remain where it now is, but may be relocated at any time hereafter in accordance with the act entitled An act establishing the mode of locating and changing county-seats. Approved

SEC, 5. If the county commissioners of said Clear Creek county, shall fail or refuse to give notice of the location of said county-seat as required by section three of this act, they shall each be fined the sum of one hundred dollars, to be recovered before any justice of the said county of Clear Creek: Provided, That the failure or refusal of said county commissioners to give notice as aforesaid, shall not defeat or delay the location of the county-seat as determined by the majority of the votes cast as aforesaid.

SEC. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and af-

ter its passage.
