#### AN ACT

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE ORDI-NARY EXPENSES OF THE EXECUTIVE, LEGISLATIVE AND JUDICIAL DEPARTMENTS OF THE STATE OF COLORADO, AND STATE INSTITUTIONS, FOR THE FIS-CAL YEAR 1953-1954, AND FOR THE PAYMENT OF ADDITIONAL EXPENSES OF THE THIRTY-NINTH GEN-ERAL ASSEMBLY.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. Definitions. As used in this Act, unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the term:

- 1. Maintenance and Operation shall include:
- (a) Contractual Services, which means services performed by firms or individuals other than for employment compensation and includes the furnishing of commodities and traveling expenses;
- (b) Supplies and Materials, which mean commodities Definitions which, by nature, are consumable, or which, after first usage show a material change in, or impariment of, physical condition and which have a useful life of less than one year;

- Current Charges, which mean and include dues and subscriptions, insurance, licenses, rents, grants, donations and other fixed charges;
- (d) Current Obligations, which mean and include awards, property damages, personal injuries debt service, special assessments against State property, judgments and losses; and

#### 2. Capital Outlay shall include:

- (a) Equipment, which means and includes machinery, implements, instruments, tools, furniture, vehicles, apparatus and reference books that may be used continuously without material change in physical condition, or which may be said to have a useful life for a period of more than one year;
- (b) Remodeling, Major Repairs and Replacements of Existing Structures, which mean and include payments made to contractors for remodeling buildings, making major repairs, or replacing existing structures;
- (c) New Structures, which mean and include payments made for the acquisition of new buildings and other structures, or payments made to contractors for the erection of new buildings and other structures;
- (d) Land and Non-structural Improvements to Land, which means and includes payment made for the acquisition of land or payments made to contractors for non-structural improvements made to land.

Appropriation

Section 2. The following designated sums, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general revenue fund, except as herein otherwise provided, for the payment of the ordinary expenses of the executive, legislative and judicial departments of the state, and the state institutions for the fiscal year 1953-1954. The appropriations for personal services and payment of salaries therefrom shall be subject to any applicable law, or laws or constitutional provisions relating to the compensation of officers and employees of the state, or any of its departments, institutions or agencies.

Section 40.

Payment

All appropriations of moneys hereby appropriated and which are payable out of administrative or cash funds heretofore established by law are made as specific appropriations and the amounts payable from said funds are limited hereby and only the amounts designated herein shall be paid from each such fund.

Section 41.

Constitutionality.

Constitutionality Clause If any provision of this Act or application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or applications, and to this end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

Section 42.

The General Assembly hereby finds, determines and declares that this Act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety.

Approved: April 4, 1953 with exception of Section 19 (e) and Section 36 (m), which sections are hereby vetoed.

#### \*PARTIAL VETO

To the Honorable Homer M. Bruce Secretary of State of the State of Colorado Dear Sir:

I hereby file House Bill No. 483, entitled "An Act to Provide for the Payment of the Ordinary Expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the State of Colorado, and State Institutions, for the Fiscal Year 1953-54, and for the Payment of Additional Expenses of the Thirty-ninth General Assembly." This bill is approved with the exception of Section 19 (e) "Public Welfare—Aid to Indigent Residents Afflicted with Tuberculosis"—\$225,000.00 and Section 36 (m) "Colorado School of Mines"—\$673,000.00.

The above mentioned sections are hereby vetoed for the reason that funds are available from other sources for the same purposes.
