#### AN ACT

Authorizing the County Commissioners of the County of Las Animas to levy a Special Tax to build a Court House.

Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of Colorado Territory:

SECTION 1. The County Commissioners of the County of Las Animas may, and are hereby authorized, if they deem it advisable, to levy a special tax of not less than one mill nor more than two and onehalf mills to the dollar, of the assessed valuation of property in said county each year, for the purpose of crecting a court house for said county, which fund shall, when collected, be kept as a separate fund for such purpose by the Treasurer of said county, and shall be paid out by him on the order of the County Commissioners of said county.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

Approved February 9th, 1872.

### AN ACT

To Authorize County Commissioners to require new bond from Sheriffs and other County Officers in certain cases.

Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of Colorado Territory :

SECTION 1. Whenever the Board of County Commissioners of any county in this Territory shall deem the bond given by the Sheriff or other officer of their county insufficient, or whenever in their opinion the sureties on said bond are insolvent, or permanently removed from the county, or whenever they for any other reason shall consider said bond insufficient for the public security, it shall be lawful
