APPROPRIATION.

RELIEF OF JESSE S. RANDALL AND JOHN OLD.

(S. B. No. 144, by Senator O'Connell.)

AN ACT

APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF FIVE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE (\$525.00) DOLLARS FOR THE RELIEF OF JESSE S. RANDALL AND JOHN OLD.

Be it Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. That there is hereby appropriated out Appropriation. of any money in the State Treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of five hundred and twenty-five (\$525.00) dollars. Four hundred (\$400.00) dollars for the benefit of Jesse S. Randall to reimburse him for money expended by him for the State of Colorado, as well as for expenses otherwise incurred in behalf of the State in connection with the Saint Louis Exposition; and one hundred and twenty-five (\$125.00) to John Old in payment for ore loaned by him for exhibition purposes to the State of Colorado, in the mineral department of the State's exhibit at the said exposition and which was never returned nor accounted for to him in any way.

Section 2. Upon the passage of this act, the State Auditor draw Auditor is hereby directed to draw warrants upon the warrants. State Treasurer in favor of the parties herein named and in their respective amounts.

Section 3. Whereas, in the opinion of the General $_{\text{Emergency.}}$ Assembly, an emergency exists; therefore, this act shall be in force and effect from and after its passage.
