APPROPRIATION

RELIEF OF H. F. ALLEN

(House Bill No. 5. By Representative Harding)

AN ACT

AN ACT FOR THE RELIEF OF H. F. ALLEN OF YAMPA, COLORADO.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1.—Appropriation—There is hereby appropriated, out of the Game Cash Fund, for the relief of H. F. Allen, owner of the M. & E. Market, at Yampa, Colorado, the sum of two thousand three hundred eighty-six dollars and fifty cents (\$2,386.50), to cover loss of game and fish license blanks inadvertently deposited in a waste paper basket by an employee of said H. F. Allen, and destroyed.

Section 2. A warrant shall be drawn in the amount of the appropriation hereby made, payable to H. F. Allen, and the state treasurer is hereby directed to pay the same.

Section 3. The General Assembly hereby finds, determines and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety.
