CHAME AND MOINTED

STATE LANDS—TRANSFER

IN OVID, COLORADO TO PRESENT OWNERS

(House Bill No. 362. By Representatives Hamil and Poe.)

ANACT

AUTHORIZING THE SALE AND CONVEYANCE OF CERTAIN LAND LOCATED IN THE TOWN OF OVID, COUNTY OF SEDGWICK.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1.—Sale of land authorized — description— The state of Colorado, acting by its governor and the commissioner of education, is hereby authorized to convey Lots one (1) to eight (8), inclusive, and Lots twentyfive (25) to thirty-two (32), inclusive, all in Block thirteen (13), Town of Ovid, in the County of Sedgwick, Colorado, and to transfer by quitclaim deed of conveyance all of its right, title and interest in said property to the present owners thereof.

Section 2.—Safety Clause—The General Assembly hereby finds, determines and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety.
