FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF COLORADO,

1876-7.

REPEALING FORMER LAWS ONLY.

AN ACT TO REPEAL SECTION TWO (2) OF AN ACT ENTITLED AN ACT CONCERNING COSTS IN CERTAIN CASES, APPROVED FEBRUARY 11, 1876.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. That section two (2) of an act entitled an act concerning costs in certain cases, approved February 11, A. D. 1876, be and the same is hereby repealed.

SEC. 2. Nothing in this repeal shall apply to cases pending in court at the time this act takes effect.

Approved, January 31, 1877.

AN ACT TO REPEAL AN ACT ENTITLED "AN ACT CONCERNING COSTS IN CRIMINAL CASES," APPROVED FEBRUARY 7, 1876.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. That an act entitled "an act concerning costs in criminal cases," approved February 7, 1876, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

SEC. 2. Inasmuch as the act hereby repealed, in many cases works great hardships to innocent parties, and justice is impeded in certain cases, it is considered that an emergency exists, requiring that this act take effect immediately; therefore, this act shall take effect immediately upon its passage.

Approved, February 8, 1877.
