CHAPTER 144.

GOLD CREEK.

(H. B. No. 277, by Mr. Pearson.)

AN ACT

CHANGING THE NAME OF OHIO CREEK AT OHIO CITY, GUN-NISON COUNTY TO THAT OF GOLD CREEK.

Be it Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
