An Act

APPROPRIATING TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS FOR THE BENEFIT OF
THE STATE HORTICULTURAL AND FORESTRY ASSOCIATION.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

\$2,000
appropriated.

SECTION I. There shall be and hereby is appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated the sum of two thousand dollars, for the use of the Colorado State Horticultural and Forestry Association, to be paid one thousand dollars in the year 1889, and one thousand dollars in the year 1890, upon such society complying with the requirements of chapter LII. of the General Statutes of Colorado, entitled "Horticulture."

STATE INDUSTRIAL SCHOOL.

(H. B. 109)

An Act

CONCERNING THE STATE INDUSTRIAL SCHOOL AT GOLDEN, PROVIDING FOR THE MAINTENANCE AND CARRYING ON OF THE SAME, AND REPEALING CERTAIN LAWS RELATING THERETO.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

\$50,000 appropriated for support and maintenance of state industrial school at Golden.

SECTION I. That for the general support and maintenance of the State Industrial School at Golden for the years 1889 and 1890, including the salaries of officers and employes of the institution, and for insuring the buildings and furniture thereof, and for paying the expense of printing the biennial report of the school to the State Superintendent of Public Instruction, there is
