CHAPTER 242

STATE LANDS—TRANSFER

GAME AND FISH COMMISSION TO HIGHEST BIDDER

(Senate Bill No. 260. By Senators Cook and Hobbs; also Representative Gaylord.)

AN ACT

AUTHORIZING THE GAME AND FISH COMMISSION TO SELL
CERTAIN LANDS IN PUEBLO COUNTY BY SEALED BIDS.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. (1) The Game and Fish Commission is hereby authorized and empowered to receive sealed bids and to sell to the highest bidder the following described surplus lands in whole or by parcels, as may be determined by said commission:

So much of the Northwest Quarter of Section 32, Township 24 South, Range 67 West, as constitutes the state fish hatchery known as the Rye hatchery, comprising 18 acres more or less, and situate in Pueblo County, Colorado.

(2) Said sale shall be made after publication giving fifteen days notice of such sale, dating the time and specifying where such bids shall be submitted.

(3) The Game and Fish Commission reserves the right to reject any or all bids reserving however, unto the State of Colorado, all oil, gas and mineral rights in connection therewith.

Section 2. The money derived from the sale of the above described land shall be paid into the game cash fund.

Section 3.—**Safety Clause**—The General Assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety.
