COLORADO STATE GAME REFUGE

(S. B. No. 185, by Senators Girard, Warren and Toll)

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 1 OF AN ACT ENTITLED, "AN ACT TO CREATE AND ESTABLISH THE COLORADO STATE GAME REFUGE AND TO REGULATE AND PROHIBIT THE HUNTING OR KILLING OF GAME THEREIN, AND TO PROVIDE CERTAIN PENALTIES," APPROVED MARCH 29, 1919, AND BEING CHAPTER 99 OF THE SESSION LAWS OF COLORADO 1919.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. That Section 1 of Chapter 99 of the Session Laws of 1919 be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows: Section amended

Section 1. For the better protection of birds and animals and the establishment of breeding places therefor, the following area within the State of Colorado is hereby set aside, designated, and established as a State Game Refuge. All that portion of the State of Colorado, embraced within the following described boundary, which area shall constitute and be known as THE COLORADO STATE GAME REFUGE: Game refuge established

Beginning at the point where the west line of Section Fourteen (14), Township Eight (8) North, Range Seventy (70) West, Sixth (6) Principal Meri- Boundaries

dian, crosses the north bank of the Cache La Poudre River; thence following westerly along the north bank of the main stream of the said Cache La Poudre River to a point where said river crosses the Second Correction Line North at approximately the northwest corner of Section One (1), Township Eight (8) North, Range Seventy-five (75) West; thence west along the said Correction Line to a point where said line cuts the western boundary of the Colorado National Forest on the crest of the Medicine Bow Mountains; thence following southerly and easterly along the boundary between the Colorado National Forest and the Arapaho National Forest to a point common to the Colorado National Forest, the Arapaho National Forest and the Rocky Mountain National Park, approximately at northeast corner of Section Twenty (20), Township Six (6) North, Range Seventy-five (75) West; thence northerly and easterly and following the boundary between the Colorado National Forest and the Rocky Mountain National Park to the northeast corner of said park; thence southerly along the east boundary of the Rocky Mountain National Park to the Southeast corner of said park; thence westerly along the boundary between the said the Colorado National Forest and the said the Rocky Mountain National Park to the crest of the Continental Divide; thence southerly following the crest of said Divide along the boundary between the Colorado National Forest and the Arapaho National Forest to the northwest corner of Gilpin County; thence easterly along the boundary between Gilpin and Boulder Counties to the northwest corner of Gilpin County; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of Gilpin County to the northwest corner of Jefferson County; thence easterly along the boundary line between Boulder and Jefferson

Counties to the point where said boundary line intersects the Range Line between Ranges Seventy (70) and Seventy-one (71) West, of the Sixth (6) Principal Meridian; thence north along said Range Line to the point where said Range Line intersects the easterly or southerly boundary line of the Colorado National Forest at or about the west quarter corner of Section Nineteen (19), Township Five (5) North, Range Seventy (70) West of the Sixth (6) Principal Meridian in Larimer County; thence northerly along the east boundary of said The Colorado National Forest to the southwest corner of Section Twenty-seven (27) Township Six (6) North, Range Seventy (70) West of the Sixth (6) Principal Meridian; thence north along the section lines on the west side of Sections Twenty-seven (27), Twenty-two (22), Fifteen (15), Ten (10) and Three (3), in Township Six (6) North, Range Seventy (70) West of the Sixth (6) Principal Meridian to the northwest corner of said Section Three (3) of Township Six (6) North, Range Seventy (70) West of the Sixth (6) Principal Meridian; thence easterly and northerly along the eastern boundary of said The Colorado National Forest to the southwest corner of Section Fourteen (14) Township Eight (8) North, Range Seventy (70) West Sixth (6) Principal Meridian; thence north along west side of said Section Fourteen (14) to the north bank of Cache La Poudre River, the point of beginning; provided, that nothing in this Act shall be construed to prevent the pasturing of domestic animals upon said game refuge or the right of ingress or egress of such animals thereon.

Pasturing of domestic animals on refuge not prohibited
