#### CRIMES AND PUNISHMENTS

ANARCHY - SEDITION - DISLOYALTY

(Senate Bill No. 42. By Senator Bennett; also Representatives Kane, Thomson, Stockton and Anderson.)

### AN ACT

AMENDING THE PENALTY PROVISIONS OF 40-23-13, COLORADO REVISED STATUTES 1953, RELATING TO ANARCHY, SEDITION AND DISLOYALTY.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. 40-23-13, Colorado Revised Statutes 1953, is hereby amended to read:

40-23-13.—Penalty.—Any person who shall be guilty of any of these offenses defined in sections 40-23-7 to 40-23-12, upon conviction, shall be punished by imprisonment IN THE STATE PENITENTIARY not exceeding twenty years, or by fine not exceeding ten thousand dollars or by both such fine and imprisonment; and any corporation, organization, association, or society committing any of the offenses hereinbefore defined, shall, upon conviction, be fined in a sum not exceeding ten thousand dollars and in addition the officers thereof shall be punished by imprisonment IN THE STATE PENITENTIARY for a term not exceeding LESS THAN ONE YEAR NOR MORE THAN twenty years, or by fine not exceeding ten thousand dollars or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 2.—Safety clause.—The general assembly hereby finds. determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
