CHAPTER 36.

APPROPRIATION-C, E, HAGAR.

(S. B. No. 186, by Senator Thomas.)

AN ACT

APPROPRIATING MONEY TO PAY C. E. HAGAR FOR SERVICES
RENDERED DURING THE OPENING DAYS OF THE SESSION
OF THE SENATE OF THE TWELFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

Be it Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. Whereas, C. E. Hagar served as Secre-Appropriation. tary in the opening days of the Session of the Senate of the Twelfth General Assembly, and prior to its organization; there is hereby appropriated out of the general fund the sum of Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for the payment of such services.

Sec. 2. The Auditor of the State is hereby author: Auditor draw ized to issue a warrant in the following amount: warrant.

To C. E. Hagar.....\$25.00

Sec. 3. In the opinion of the General Assembly an Emergency emergency exists; therefore this act shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage.
