STATE LANDS — SALE

SALE OF ARMORY AT GREELEY, COLORADO, AUTHORIZED

(Senate Bill No. 17. By Senators Oliver, Miller and Cleary; also Representatives Magnuson, Littler and Love.)

AN ACT

AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF THE "OLD" STATE ARMORY AT GREELEY, WELD COUNTY, COLORADO.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1.—Sale authorized.—The adjutant general is hereby authorized to sell the following described lands, and improvements thereon, in Weld County, Colorado, now known as the "old" state armory at Greeley:

The South Sixty (60) feet of Lots Six (6), Seven (7) and Eight (8), in Block Thirty Eight (38), City of Greeley, Weld County, State of Colorado, including all buildings and improvements thereon; and the East Ten (10) feet of Lot Six (6) in Block Thirty Eight (38), City of Greeley, Weld County, State of Colorado, for joint reciprocal and perpetual use by the owners of adjoining properties as a private alley.

Section 2.—**Proceeds deposited**—deed executed.— Said sale shall be for such amount as shall be approved by the governor, and the proceeds thereof shall be placed in the military fund. The necessary deed of conveyance to effectuate such sale shall be executed by the governor under the seal of the state.

Section 3.—Safety clause.—The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

Approved: February 1, 1962.
