CHAPTER 61

ARMISTICE DAY

WHEN FALLING ON SUNDAY

(S. D. No. 155, by Senator Wheeler)

AN ACT

AMENDING SESSION LAWS OF 1919, CHAPTER 153, TO PROVIDE THAT WHEN LIBERTY OR ARMISTICE DAY FALLS UPON SUNDAY THAT THE SUCCEEDING MONDAY SHALL BE THE PUBLIC HOLIDAY.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section Repealed

Section 1. That Section 2, Session Laws of 1919, Chapter 153, be and the same is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof Section 2 shall read as follows:

When Falling on Sunday

Section 2. That whenever the eleventh day of November falls upon Sunday, the succeeding Monday is hereby designated as the day for celebrating such event.

Legal Transactions not Affected

Provided this Act shall not be construed to affect the making or execution of agreements or instruments in writing or interfere with judicial proceedings.

Approved February 28, 1929.
