CHAPTER 292

WATER RIGHTS AND IRRIGATION

UNDERGROUND WATER

(Senate Bill No. 39. By Senators Locke, Shoemaker, and Brown; also Representative Kelley.)

AN ACT

AMENDING 147-19-14, COLORADO REVISED STATUTES 1953 (1960 PERM. SUPP.), CONCERNING THE GROUND WATER FUND.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. 147-19-14, Colorado Revised Statutes 1953 (1960 Perm. Supp.), is hereby amended to read:

147-19-14.—**Ground water fund.**—All monies collected as filing fees in compliance with sections 147-19-2 and 147-19-5 and all monies collected as license fees in compliance with section 147-19-10 shall be paid into the state treasury AND CREDITED TO THE GENERAL FUND, and placed in a separate account known as the "ground water fund". The general assembly shall appropriate therefrom FROM THE GENERAL FUND to the state engineer and the commission the expenses of administering this article. Expenditures shall be made by voucher signed by the state engineer and countersigned by the secretary of the commission.

Section 2.—**Effective date.**—This act shall take effect on July 1, 1963, and any unencumbered monies remaining to the credit of the ground water fund on said date shall revert to the general fund.

Section 3.—**Safety clause.**—The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

Approved: March 27, 1963.
