#### AN ACT

AMENDING CHAPTER 144 OF THE SESSION LAWS OF COLO-RADO 1963, CONCERNING CHANGES IN SENATORIAL DISTRICT BOUNDARIES.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. Section 4 of chapter 144, Session Laws of Colorado 1963, is hereby amended to read:

Section 4.—Senatorial districts to coincide with county line changes.—To the extent that the boundaries of the senatorial districts established hereby pursuant to said sections 45, 46, 47, and 48 of article V of the constitution of Colorado coincide with county lines, such senatorial district boundaries shall continue to coincide therewith in the event that such county lines are changed. IN CASES INVOLVING CHANGES IN COUNTY LINES WHERE THE NEWLY ACQUIRED TERRITORY IS CONTIGUOUS TO TWO OR MORE SENATORIAL DISTRICTS WITHIN THE COUNTY TO WHICH ANNEXED, SUCH ANNEXED TERRITORY SHALL BE INCLUDED IN THAT CONTIGUOUS SENATORIAL DISTRICT CONTAINING THE LESSER POPULATION AS DETERMINED BY THE LAST PRECEDING FEDERAL DECENNIAL CENSUS.

Section 2.—Safety Clause.—The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is

necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
