CHANGE OF NAMES

PROCEDURE

(House Bill No. 1344. By Representatives Skelton, Moore, Grandy, Cole, Carroll, Safran, Singer, and Haskell.)

AN ACT

AMENDING 20-1-1, COLORADO REVISED STATUTES 1963,
CONCERNING COURTS IN WHICH PETITION MAY BE
FILED BY PERSONS WISHING TO CHANGE THEIR
NAMES.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. 20-1-1, Colorado Revised Statutes 1963,
is hereby amended to read:

20-1-1.—**Petition—proceedings.**—Every person desiring to change his or her name may present a petition to that effect, verified by affidavit, to the district, SUPERIOR, or county court, in the county of the petitioner's residence, which petition shall set forth the petitioner's full name, the new name desired, and a concise statement of the reason for such desired change. The judge of such court shall order such change to be made, and spread upon the records of the court in proper form, if such judge is satisfied that the desired change would be proper, and not detrimental to the interests of any other person.

Section 2.—**Safety clause.**—The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

Capital letters indicate new material added to existing statutes; dashes through words indicate deletions from existing statutes and such material not part of act.
