SCHOOLS I—PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM

SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARDS-POWERS AND DUTIES

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 10 OF CHAPTER 73, SESSION LAWS OF COLORADO 1964, RELATING TO EDUCATION.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. Section 10 of chapter 73, Session Laws of Colorado 1964, is hereby amended BY THE ADDITION OF THE FOLLOWING SUBSECTIONS (30) AND (31) to read:

Section 10.—Board of education—specific powers.—(30) To provide, in the discretion of the local board, out of federal grants made available specifically for this purpose, special educational services and arrangements (such as dual enrollment, educational radio and television and mobile educational services) for the benefit of educationally deprived children in the district who attend nonpublic schools, without the requirement of full time public school attendance, and without discrimination on the ground of race, color, religion, or national origin.

(31) To provide, in the discretion of the local board, out of federal grants made available specifically for this purpose, library resources (which for the purposes of this chapter shall mean books, periodicals, documents, magnetic tapes, films, phonograph records, and other related library materials) and printed and published instructional materials for the use and benefit of

all children in the district, and the use of teachers to benefit all children in the district, both in the public and nonpublic schools, without charge and without discrimination on the ground of race, color, religion, or national origin.

Section 2.—Safety clause.—The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
