### REGISTRATION OF SUBDIVISION DEVELOPERS

## AN ACT

AMENDING 118-16-4 (1), COLORADO REVISED STATUTES 1963, CONCERNING THE REGISTRATION OF SUBDIVISION DEVELOPERS.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. 118-16-4 (1), Colorado Revised Statutes 1963, is hereby amended to read:

118-16-4.—Registration of developers.—(1) Except as provided in section 118-16-5, the commission shall register all applicants and provide each applicant so registered with a certificate indicating that the person, firm, partnership, joint venture, association, or corporation named therein is registered in the state of Colorado as a subdivision developer. A CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO A DEVELOPER SHALL ENTITLE ALL SALES AGENTS AND EMPLOYEES OF SUCH DEVELOPER TO ACT IN THE CAPACITY OF A DEVELOPER AS AGENT FOR SUCH DEVELOPER.

Section 2.—Safety clause.—The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
