### CHAPTER 38

## **ROADS AND HIGHWAYS**

#### PROPERTY ADJACENT TO FEDERAL AID HIGHWAYS

## AN ACT

AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF HIGHWAYS TO AC-QUIRE PROPERTY ADJACENT TO FEDERAL-AID HIGH-WAYS NECESSARY FOR THE RESTORATION, PRES-ERVATION, AND ENHANCEMENT OF SCENIC BEAUTY AND FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF REST, RECREATION, AND SANITARY AREAS.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. 120-3-10 (2), Colorado Revised Statutes 1963, is hereby amended to read:

120-3-10.-Acquisition and disposition of property.-(2)The department of highways may acquire BY PUR-CHASE OR CONDEMNATION excess right-of-way whenever in the opinion of the chief engineer, public interest, safety, or convenience will be served by acquiring such excess. IN CONNECTION WITH THE CONSTRUCTION. MAINTENANCE, AND SUPERVISION OF THE PUB-LIC HIGHWAYS OF THIS STATE. THE DEPART-MENT MAY ALSO ACQUIRE BY PURCHASE OR CON-DEMNATION STRIPS OR PARCELS OF LAND, OR INTERESTS THEREIN, ADJACENT TO FEDERAL-AID HIGHWAYS NECESSARY FOR THE RESTORA-TION, PRESERVATION, AND ENHANCEMENT OF SCENIC BEAUTY AND FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF REST, RECREATION, AND SANITARY AREAS; PRO-VIDED, THAT NO STATE FUNDS SHALL BE EX-PENDED TO ACQUIRE SAID STRIPS OR PARCELS

Capital letters indicate new material added to existing statutes; dashes through words indicate deletions from existing statutes and such material not part of act. OF LAND, OR INTERESTS THEREIN, NECESSARY FOR THE RESTORATION, PRESERVATION, AND EN-HANCEMENT OF SCENIC BEAUTY AND FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF REST, RECREATION, AND SANI-TARY AREAS, UNLESS THE ACQUISITION AND DE-VELOPMENT OF LAND FOR SUCH PURPOSES IS APPROVED BY THE SECRETARY OF COMMERCE TO MAKE THE STATE ELIGIBLE FOR REIMBURSE-MENT FROM FEDERAL FUNDS.

Section 2.—Safety clause.—The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
