CHAPTER 51

PLANNING COMMISSIONS—STATE AND COUNTY

COUNTY PLANNING

(Senate Bill No. 112, By Senators Scott, Lucas, and Williams; also Representatives Cole, Fuhr, Gossard, Horst, Johnson, Koster, Mackle, Shore, and Woodfin.)

AN ACT

AMENDING CHAPTER 106-2-2 (2), COLORADO REVISED STATUTES 1963, AND PROVIDING THAT THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS SHALL BE-COME EX OFFICIO NONVOTING MEMBERS OF COUNTY PLANNING COM-MISSIONS, IN ADDITION TO THE APPOINTED MEMBERS THEREOF.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. 106-2-2 (2), Colorado Revised Statutes 1963, is amended to read:

106-2-2. County planning commission.—(2) The chairman of the board of county commissioners shall ex officie be a member of such commission. IN AD-DITION TO THE FIVE APPOINTED MEMBERS, THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS SHALL APPOINT ONE OF THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD AS EX OFFICIO NONVOTING MEMBER OF SUCH COMMISSION. Each of the other four SUCH FIVE members of the commission shall be a resident of the county and the owner of real property situated therein. The term of appointed members of the commission shall be four FIVE years and until their respective successors have been appointed, but the terms of office shall be staggered by making the initial four FIVE appointments for one, two, three, ase four, AND FIVE years respectively.

Section 2. Safety clause.—The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

Capital letters indicate new material added to existing statutes; dashes through words indicate deletions from existing statutes and such material not part of act.
