AMENDING 139-49-18 AND 139-81-2 (1) AND REPEALING 139-81-2 (2) AND (3),
COLORADO REVISED STATUTES 1963, CONCERNING BOARD OF TRUSTEES
OF THE POLICEMEN'S PENSION FUND.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. 139-49-18, Colorado Revised Statutes 1963, is amended to read:

139-49-18. Does not repeal existing statutes.—EXCEPT AS TO MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES, the provisions of this article are not intended to and shall not be construed to in any manner, change, alter or repeal article 81 of this chapter.

Section 2. 139-81-2 (1), Colorado Revised Statutes 1963, is amended to read:

139-81-2. Trustees.—(1) The general supervision, management and control of said policemen's pension fund shall be vested as by this article provided in a board to be known as "the board of trustees of the policemen's pension fund", which board shall be composed of seven members, namely: the mayor, the president of the fire and police board, the city treasurer, the chief of the police department, the city auditor, or the officers, respectively, corresponding to and performing the duties respectively of such mayor, president of the fire and police board, city treasurer, chief of police department and city auditor whatever the name or form of government of such city is or may hereafter be, together with two other members, as provided in this section. The two other members who with the members above designated shall constitute or compose said board; shall be chosen, one, from among the policemen, and one, from the body of pensioners of such city, under this article. The members to be chosen from among the policemen, shall be elected by ballot at an annual election, at which election all such policemen shall be entitled to vote SUCH PERSONS OR OFFICIALS AS MAY BE DESIGNATED BY THE CHARTER OF THE MUNICIPALITY AND ORDINANCES THEREOF.

Capital letters indicate new material added to existing statutes; dashes through words indicate deletions from existing statutes and such material not part of act.

Section 3. **Repeal.**—189-81-2 (2) and (3), Colorado Revised Statutes 1963, are repealed.

Section 4. **Safety clause.**—The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
