CHAPTER 39

GAME, FISH, AND PARKS

GAME, FISH, AND PARKS COMMISSION

(Senate Bill No. 11. By Senators Oliver, Cleneros, Donlon, Garneey, and Hewett.)

AN ACT

AMENDING 62-2-1 (1) (a), COLORADO REVISED STATUTES 1963, CONCERNING THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE GAME, FISH, AND PARKS COMMISSION.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. 62-2-1 (1) (a), Colorado Revised Statutes 1963, is amended to read:

62-2-1. Game, fish, and parks commission.—(1) (a) The game, and fish, AND PARKS department is hereby placed under the jurisdiction of a commission, to be known as the game, fish, and parks commission, hereinafter referred to as the commission. Such commission shall consist of eleven members, one of whom shall be the governor NATURAL RESOURCES COORDINATOR of this state as an ex officio member of the commission, eight members of the commission shall be chosen from districts as provided in this section 62-2-1, and two members who shall be chosen from the state at large. APPOINTMENTS TO THE COMMISSION SHALL BE MADE BY AND WITH THE CONSENT OF THE SENATE. For the purpose of this chapter, the state of Colorado is hereby divided into eight game, and fish, AND PARKS districts, to be numbered from one to eight.

Section 2. Safety clause.—The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

Capital letters indicate new material added to existing statutes; dashes through words indicate deletions from existing statutes and such material not part of act.
