COURTS OF RECORD**GENERAL PROVISIONS**

(Senate Bill No. 78. By Senator Dines.)

A N A C T

AMENDING 37-1-14, COLORADO REVISED STATUTES 1963, CONCERNING SEAL OF SUMMONING COURT ON CERTAIN JURY SUMMONS.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. 37-1-14, Colorado Revised Statutes 1963, is amended to read:

37-1-14. Seal, how attached.—A seal of a court or public officer, when required to any writ, or process, or proceeding, or to authenticate a copy of any record or document, may be impressed with wax, wafer, or any other substance, and then attached to the writ, process, or proceeding, or to the copy of the record or document, or it may be impressed on the paper alone; **BUT WHEN JURY SUMMONS ARE PREPARED BY MEANS OF MECHANICAL REPRODUCTION, THE SEAL OF THE SUMMONING COURT MAY BE PRINTED THEREON INSTEAD OF BEING IMPRESSED.**

Section 2. **Safety clause.**—The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

Capital letters indicate new material added to existing statutes; dashes through words indicate deletions from existing statutes and such material not part of act.
