CHAPTER 302

#### GAME, FISH, AND PARKS

USE FEE PERMITS

(Senate Bill No. 187, By Senators Jackson, Garnsey, and Oliver; also Representative Schubert.)

#### ANACT

AMENDING 62-13-19, COLORADO REVISED STATUTES 1963 (1965 SUPP.), CONCERNING VIOLATIONS OF USE FEE PERMIT REQUIREMENTS.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

- Section 1. 62-13-19 (4) Colorado Revised Statutes 1963 (1965 Supp.), is amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW PARAGRAPH (v) to read:
- 62-13-19. Violations—penalty—payment.—(4) (y) Drive, park, or operate a motor vehicle upon a department recreation facility without a use fee permit issued pursuant to section 62-19-2 (1) (c)—ten dollars. The provisions of this paragraph (y) shall not apply to any person who drives through such recreation facility on a public road. Upon receipt by the department of any moneys in payment for a violation of this paragraph (y), the department shall forthwith mail to the violator a use permit valid for the balance of the current permit period.
- Section 2. Safety clause.—The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
