SCHOOLS I—PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEMTRINIDAD JUNIOR COLLEGE

(House Bill No. 1689. By Representative Mackie.)

A N A C T

AMENDING 123-24-3, COLORADO REVISED STATUTES 1963, CONCERNING THE JUNIOR COLLEGE AT TRINIDAD.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. 123-24-3, Colorado Revised Statutes 1963, is amended to read:

123-24-3. Junior college of Trinidad.—A junior college is hereby established at the city of Trinidad, in the county of Las Animas, and state of Colorado, to be known as "The Junior College of Trinidad, Colorado", for the purpose of providing instruction in the arts and sciences and in such branches of knowledge as may be designated by the board of trustees of said institution so as to provide a junior college or school which shall give instruction covering the first two years of the usual college course in the sciences and liberal arts, and the art of teaching, and so as to permit the graduates of the said junior college to be admitted to the higher courses and the different professional schools of the university of Colorado, ~~normal schools, and other institutions of like character;~~ CHARACTER, provided that A suitable tract of land shall be donated to the state of Colorado for the site of said institution.

Section 2. Safety clause.—The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

Capital letters indicate new material added to existing statutes; dashes through words indicate deletions from existing statutes and such material not part of act.
