#### GAME, FISH, AND PARKS

FUR-BEARING ANIMALS

(House Bill No. 1354, By Representative Schubert; also Senator Jackson.)

#### ANACT

AMENDING 62-6-10 (1), COLORADO REVISED STATUTES 1963, CONCERNING THE LICENSE FEE FOR A RESIDENT TRAPPER'S LICENSE.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. 62-6-10 (1), Colorado Revised Statutes 1963, is amended to read:

62-6-10. Resident trapper's license.—(1) It shall be unlawful for any person who has passed his fourteenth birthday to trap, or in any manner kill, take, capture, or hunt any fur-bearing animal without first having procured from the commission or any person designated by law, a resident trapper's license. A resident trapper's license may be issued to any such person who has passed his fourteenth birthday, and who has been a bona fide resident of the state of Colorado for one year next preceding the day of issuance of such license, anon the payment of a fee of two dollars. The application for such license, and the license shall be in such form and contain such information as the commission may prescribe.

Section 2. Effective date.—This act shall take effect January 1, 1968.

Section 3. Safety clause.—The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

Capital letters indicate new material added to existing statutes; dashes through words indicate deletions from existing statutes and such material not part of act.
