CHAPTER 287

INSURANCE

GENERAL PROVISIONS

(House Bill No. 1419. By Representatives Braden and Koster; also Senator Schieffelin.)

ANACT

AMENDING 72-1-4 (2), COLORADO REVISED STATUTES 1963, RELATING TO EMPLOYEES REQUIRED BY THE COMMISSIONER OF INSURANCE FOR THE TRANSACTION OF THE BUSINESS OF HIS OFFICE.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

- Section 1. 72-1-4 (2), Colorado Revised Statutes 1963, is amended to read:
- 72-1-4. Commissioner of insurance.—(2) The commissioner shall have such employees as may be required for the transaction of the business of his office. One shall be deputy commissioner of insurance who shall be authorized in all matters to act as and for the commissioner of insurance in the absence of the commissioner. Examiners shall be classified as senior and junior. A senior examiner shall have had three full years' experience in the examination of insurance companies as an employee of the A STATE insurance department. of Gelevador The salary and term of office of the commissioner and the employees of the department shall be fixed pursuant to article XII, section 13, of the constitution of Colorado.
- Section 2. Safety clause.—The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

Capital letters indicate new material added to existing statutes; dashes through words indicate deletions from existing statutes and such material not part of act.
