CHAPTER 111

INTOXICATING LIQUORS

LIQUOR CODE OF 1935

(House Bill No. 1246. By Representatives Singer, Baer, Braden, Calabrese, Dameron, Fentress, Mullen, Norgren, and Wilder; also Senators Denny, Donlon, Jackson, Oliver, Rockwell, Schleffelin, Stockton, Taylor, and Vollack.)

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 75-2-3, COLORADO REVISED STATUTES 1963, PERTAINING TO SALES, SHIPMENTS, OR DELIVERIES OF, MALT, VINOUS, AND SPIRITUOUS LIQUORS IN INTERSTATE COMMERCE.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

- Section 1. 75-2-3, Colorado Revised Statutes 1963, is amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SUBSECTION (20) to read:
- 75-2-3. Unlawful acts.—(20) Nothing contained in subsections (3) and (17) of this section shall apply to sales, shipments, or deliveries made in interstate commerce, to a wholesaler, by a manufacturer of malt, vinous, or spirituous liquors.
- Section 2. Safety clause.—The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
