(House Bill No. 1187. By Representatives Cole and Safran; also Senator Decker.)

## A N A C T

AMENDING 92-2-5, AND 92-11-2, COLORADO REVISED STATUTES 1963, TO CORRECT REFERENCES TO COAL MINE INSPECTION FUND IN LAWS CONCERNING COAL MINES.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

Section 1. 92-2-5, Colorado Revised Statutes 1963, is amended to read:

92-2-5. Salaries and expenses of board.— (1) The members of the board of examiners, with the exception of the chief inspector of coal mines shall receive in addition to the per diem hereinafter mentioned in this subsection (1) SECTION, their actual traveling and other expenses incurred by them in attendance at the meetings of the board in the performance of their duties. The members of the board with the exception of the chief inspector of coal mines and the coal mining engineer, shall receive twenty-five dollars per day for each day of actual service on the board. The coal mining engineer shall receive thirty dollars per day for each day of actual service on the board. The state coal mining inspector shall not receive any extra compensation for his services on the board. The whole expenses in connection with the examining board shall be paid out of the coal mine inspection GENERAL fund provided for in section 92-11-1, or from any appropriation therefor, in accordance with the rules set forth by the state civil service commission, upon filing of the certificates of time and expenses of the examining board in the office of the state controller; which certificate shall show the actual time in which each member of said board is so engaged and shall be signed by the chairman of said board and accompanied by vouchers showing the said expenses.

Section 2. 92-11-2, Colorado Revised Statutes 1963, is amended to read:

92-11-2. Collection of fees.—In case any owner shall fail or refuse to pay any sum of money to the inspection GENERAL fund as aforesaid, the attorney general of the state is hereby authorized and directed to begin proceedings in the name of the state of Colorado for the recovery of such sum before any court of competent jurisdiction and to prosecute any such action to judgment and collect same, and any such judgment shall con-

stitute a lien upon the mine of any owner against whom such judgment is obtained.

**Section 3. Safety clause.**—The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
