CHAPTER 77

BANKRUPTCY AND INSOLVENCY

CERTIFIED COPY OF RECORDS MAY BE RECORDED IN
OFFICE OF COUNTY CLERK

(Senate Bill No. 404. By Senators Crowley and Cummings)

AN ACT

**AUTHORIZING THE RECORDING OF CERTIFIED COPIES OF
PAPERS AND ORDERS IN BANKRUPTCY MATTERS.**

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Certified Copy
May be
Recorded

Section 1. Certified copies of any document, paper, decree, or order, entered or on file in any bankruptcy matter, pending or completed in any court of the United States, may be recorded in the office of the county clerk and recorder of any county of the state of Colorado. Any such documents, papers or orders shall be considered recorded from the time the same are deposited for recording with such county clerk and recorder.

Safety Clause

Section 2. The general assembly hereby finds and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety.

Emergency

Section 3. In the opinion of the general assembly an emergency exists; and therefore this act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
