## A N A C T

AMENDING 80-21-6 (2), COLORADO REVISED STATUTES 1963, CONCERNING  
DISCRIMINATORY AND UNFAIR LABOR PRACTICES.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

Section 1. 80-21-6 (2), Colorado Revised Statutes 1963, is amended to read:

80-21-6. Discriminatory and unfair employment practices.—(2) For an employer to refuse to hire, to discharge, to promote or demote, or to discriminate in matters of compensation against any person otherwise qualified, because of race, creed, color, SEX, national origin or ancestry.

Section 2. Safety clause.—The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

*Capital letters indicate new material added to existing statutes; dashes through words indicate deletions from existing statutes and such material not part of act.*
