AUTHORIZING THE STATE CONTROLLER TO ALLOW THE ADVANCE OF MONEYS.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. 3-3-2 (21), Colorado Revised Statutes 1963, is amended to read:

3-3-2. Disbursements — rules — penalties.—(21) The controller is hereby authorized, upon written request made to him, to allow any state department or agency to draw upon its appropriation or any appropriate fund, a sum not to exceed ~~fifty~~ ONE HUNDRED dollars, to be used for the payment of emergency and incidental expenses. Items of postage, express, telegrams, and other incidental expenses may be paid from such moneys. At the end of each month, or as often as deemed practicable, the department or agency making such emergency or incidental expenditures shall submit a voucher to the controller covering the total amount of such expenditures, and shall submit a list of all such expenditures, together with proper receipts, if any, and the controller shall draw his warrant against the appropriate appropriation or fund to cover all items of expenditures which he shall approve. **THE CONTROLLER IS ALSO AUTHORIZED, UPON THE REQUEST OF ANY STATE DEPARTMENT OR AGENCY, TO ALLOW AN ADVANCE OF MONEYS TO EMPLOYEES AND OFFICIALS FOR AUTHORIZED TRAVEL ON OFFICIAL STATE BUSINESS, NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS PER PERSON, PER TRIP.**

Section 2. **Effective date.**—This act shall take effect on July 1, 1969.

Section 3. **Safety clause.**—The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
