AMENDING 35-9-1, COLORADO REVISED STATUTES 1963, CONCERNING BONDS OF COUNTY SURVEYORS.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. 35-9-1, Colorado Revised Statutes 1963, is amended to read:

35-9-1. Surveyor—election—bond.—A county surveyor shall be elected for a term of four years, who shall be a registered land surveyor as provided in section 51-2-7, C.R.S. 1963, and who shall give ~~FILE HIS OFFICIAL bond to the board of county commissioners~~ **FILE HIS OFFICIAL** ~~IN THE OFFICE OF THE COUNTY CLERK,~~ to be approved by the ~~county clerk of the proper county~~ **BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS**, in the sum of one thousand dollars, conditioned for the faithful discharge of his duties.

Section 2. **Safety clause.**—The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

Capital letters indicate new material added to existing statutes; dashes through words indicate deletions from existing statutes and such material not part of act.
