#### STATE OFFICERS

GOVERNOR

(Senate Bill No. 154. By Senators Decker and Bermingham; also Representatives Cole and Safran.)

#### ANACT

AMENDING 182-1-5, COLORADO REVISED STATUTES 1968, CONCERNING THE COMPENSATION OF CERTAIN STATE OFFICERS.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. 132-1-5, Colorado Revised Statutes 1963, is amended to read:

132-1-5. Lieutenant governor—duties.—Whenever, by the impeachment of the governor, his removal from office, death, or resignation, or absence from the state, the powers and duties of his office shall devolve upon the lieutenant governor, the salary of the governor shall cease, and the same shall be received by the lieutenant governor as a full compensation for his services, until such disability shall cease; AND UPON THE GOVERNOR'S ABSENCE FROM THE STATE, THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF HIS OFFICE SHALL DEVOLVE UPON THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR; and during the time that the lieutenant governor shall act as governor, the duties and powers of the lieutenant governor shall devolve upon the president of the senate pro tem, who, EXCEPT DURING THE GOVERNOR'S ABSENCE FROM THE STATE, shall receive the salary of the lieutenant governor during such term of service.

Section 2. Safety clause.—The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

Capital letters indicate new material added to existing statutes; dashes through word indicate deletions from existing statutes and such material not part of act.
