LICENSING AND PRACTICE ACT

House Bill No. 1293. By Representative Lindley; also Senators Noble and Williams.

ANACT

AMENDING 125-1-2 (3), COLORADO REVISED STATUTES 1963, RELATING TO THE EXPIRATION OF LICENSES OF BROKER-DEALERS, ISSUER-DEALERS, AND SALESMEN.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. 125-1-2 (3), Colorado Revised Statutes 1963, is amended to read:

- 125-1-2. Licensing of broker-dealers, issuer-dealers, and salesmen.
 (3) Every BROKER-DEALER AND ISSUER-DEALER license expires one year from its effective date unless renewed. EVERY SALESMAN LICENSE EXPIRES, UNLESS RENEWED, UPON THE EXPIRATION DATE OF THE LICENSE OF THE BROKER-DEALER OR ISSUER-DEALER HE REPRESENTS.
 - Section 2. Effective date. This act shall take effect July 1, 1971.
- Section 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
