CHAPTER 145

GAME, FISH, AND PARKS

DAMAGE BY WILDLIFE

House Bill No. 1368. By Representatives Porter, Arnold, Bishop, Edmonds, and Sooter; also Senators G. Jackson, Kinnie, Klein, Ohlson, Parker, and Wunsch.

ANACT

AMENDING 62-3-3 (1) (e), COLORADO REVISED STATUTES 1963, AS AMENDED, CONCERNING THE LIABILITY OF THE STATE FOR DAMAGES TO ORCHARDS AND CROPS CAUSED BY CERTAIN WILDLIFE.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. 62-3-3 (1) (e), Colorado Revised Statutes 1963 (1969 Supp.), is amended to read:

62-3-3. State shall be liable — when. (1) (e) Damages caused by THOSE SPECIES OF wildlife ENUMERATED IN SECTION 62-1-3 (11), to orchards established prior to January 1, 1970, crops under cultivation, and harvested crops.

Section 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
