AN ACT

AMENDING 137-3-9 (1) (c), COLORADO REVISED STATUTES 1963, CONCERNING THE DIFFIES, POWERS, AND AUTHORITY OF THE PROPERTY TAX ADMINISTRATOR.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. 137-3-9 (1) (c), Colorado Revised Statutes 1963 (1971 Supp.), is amended to read:

137-3-9. Duties, powers, and authority. (1) (c) To assist and cooperate in the administration of all laws concerning the valuing of taxable property, the assessment of same, and the levying of property taxes; AND TO ADVISE THE STATE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION, NOT LATER THAN THE FIRST DAY OF JULY OF EACH YEAR, OF ANY COMPLAINTS FILED BY HIM OR UPON PETITION OF ANY TAX LEVYING AUTHORITY OF THIS STATE WITH THE BOARD OF ASSESSMENT APPEALS CONCERNING THE VALUATION FOR ASSESSMENT OF ONE OR MORE CLASSES OR SUBCLASSES OF PROPERTY IN ANY COUNTY OF THE STATE.

Section 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

Capital letters indicate new material added to existing statutes; dashes through words indicate deletions from existing statutes and such material not part of act.
