#### **OPTOMETRY**

#### EXAMINATION FEES — OPTOMETRISTS

HOUSE BILL NO. 3232. ## AN ACT

AMENDING 102-1-14, COLORADO REVISED STATUTES 1963, RELATING TO EXAMINATION FEES FOR OPTOMETRISTS.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. 102-1-14, Colorado Revised Statutes 1963, is amended to read:

102-1-14. Examination fees. The board shall charge each person applying to it for a license to practice optometry in the state an examination fee of twenty-five ONE HUNDRED dollars.

Section 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
