CHAPTER 297

STATE FINANCE, INSTITUTIONS, ETC.

SURPLUS MONEYS IN BEDDING, FUNERAL DIRECTORS
AND EMBALMING DIVISION FUND TRANSFERRED
TO GENERAL FUND

(House Bill No. 77. By Representative Steele)

AN ACT

AUTHORIZING THE STATE TREASURER TO TRANSFER
TO THE GENERAL FUND CERTAIN SURPLUS
MONEYS NOW IN THE FUND COMMONLY KNOWN
AS THE "BEDDING, FUNERAL DIRECTORS AND EM-
BALMING DIVISION FUND."

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Surplus
Moneys
Transferred
to General
Fund

Section 1. On June 30, 1947, and at the end of each biennial fiscal period thereafter, the State Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to transfer to the General Fund any moneys in excess of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) remaining to the credit of the fund commonly known as the "Bedding, Funeral Directors and Embalming Division Fund", which said fund consists of revenues derived from the administration of Chapter 205, Session Laws of Colorado, 1941.

Repeal

Section 2. All Acts or parts of Acts in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Safety Clause

Section 3. The General Assembly hereby finds, determines and declares that this Act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety.

Emergency

Section 4. In the opinion of the General Assembly an emergency exists; therefore, this Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
