### AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 80-9-11 (I), COLORADO REVISED STATUTES 1963, AS AMENDED, CONCERNING PRIVATE EMPLOYMENT AGENCIES.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

- Section 1. 80-9-11 (1), Colorado Revised Statutes 1963 (1971 Supp.), is amended to read:
- 80-9-11. Mandatory extended payment option termination of employ-(1) No agreement for the payment of a fee by an applicant to an agency shall be enforceable unless the applicant shall have been offered extended payment terms under this subsection (1) contemporaneously with his contract with the agency. The extended payment option shall provide for payment of twenty percent of the agreed fee upon acceptance, another twenty percent thirty calendar days after acceptance, another twenty percent sixty days after acceptance, another twenty percent ninety days after acceptance, and the final twenty percent installment one hundred twenty days after acceptance. but If such employment of the applicant terminates without fault on his part or for just cause within said one hundred twenty day period. he shall not be liable for any installment payment not then accrued WHETHER OR NOT THE APPLICANT ACCEPTED THE EXTENDED PAYMENT OPTION. IF THE APPLICANT HAS PAID CASH HE SHALL BE TREATED IN THE SAME MANNER AS IF HE HAD ACCEPTED THE EXTENDED PAYMENT OPTION, AND HE SHALL BE GRANTED AN IMMEDIATE REFUND ACCORDINGLY.
  - Section 2. Effective date. This act shall take effect July 1, 1973.
- Section 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
