CHAPTER 43

AGRICULTURE I – GENERAL PROVISIONS

HOUSE BILL NO. 1204. BY REPRESENTATIVES Gunn, Youngland, Baer, Bishop, Bryant, Gustafson, Lloyd, Lucero, McNeil, Sears, Showalter, Sonnenberg, Strang, and Wells; also SENATORS Anderson and H. Brown.

AN ACT

AMENDING ARTICLE 8 OF CHAPTER 6, COLORADO REVISED STATUTES 1963, AS AMENDED. RELATING TO SEEDS.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

- Section 1. 6-8-2 (3), Colorado Revised Statutes 1963, is amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW PARAGRAPH to read:
- 6-8-2. Label requirements. (3) (d) In containers of one pound or less the year for which seed was packed.
- Section 2. 6-8-6 (1), Colorado Revised Statutes 1963, as amended, is amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW PARAGRAPH to read:
- 6-8-6. Prohibitions. (1) (k) By variety name not certified by an official seed certifying agency when it is a variety for which a certificate or application for certificate of plant variety protection under the federal "Plant Variety Protection Act" specifies sale only as a class of certified seed.
 - Section 3. Effective date. This act shall take effect January 1, 1974.
- Section 4. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

Capital letters indicate new material added to existing statutes; dashes through words indicate deletions from existing statutes and such material not part of act.
