CHAPTER 76

HIGHER EDUCATION AND VOCATIONAL TRAINING

PIKES PEAK COMMUNITY COLLEGE

SENATE BILL NO. 73. BY SENATORS Comer, Allshouse, Cooper, H. Fowler, Gallagher, Groff, Harding, Hatcher, Holme, Hughes, Kadlocek, Kogovsek, McCormick, MacManus, Phelps, D. Sandoval, P. Sandoval, Smedley, Soash, Wham, and Bishop; also REPRESENTATIVES Hefley, Becker, Brinton, Cantrell, Herzberger, Kramer, Frank, and Taylor.

AN ACT

CHANGING THE NAME OF THE EL PASO COMMUNITY COLLEGE TO PIKES PEAK COMMUNITY COLLEGE.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

- Section 1. 23-62-101, Colorado Revised Statutes 1973, is amended to read:
- 23-62-101. Creation of college under state board for community colleges and occupational education. A community college to be known and designated as the "El Paso "PIKES PEAK community college" is established at Colorado Springs, Colorado, which community college shall be a state educational institution and shall be under the control of the state board for community colleges and occupational education, referred to in this article as the "board".
- Section 2. 23-62-102, Colorado Revised Statutes 1973, is amended to read:
- 23-62-102. Objects of college. The objects of the El Paso PIKES PEAK community college are to provide and offer educational programs to meet the occupational needs of youth and adults in technical and vocational fields; to provide two-year transfer educational programs to qualify students for admission to the junior year at other colleges and universities; and to provide a broad range of programs of personal and vocational education for adults.
- Section 3. 23-62-103, Colorado Revised Statutes 1973, is amended to read:
- 23-62-103. College to be two-year college. The El Paso PIKES PEAK community college shall remain always a two-year community college and

shall admit all high school graduates and other students with comparable qualifications. In addition, any person, regardless of any previous academic experience, may be enrolled in any courses which he can reasonably be expected to successfully complete.

Section 4. 23-62-104, Colorado Revised Statutes 1973, is amended to read:

23-62-104. Board to develop comprehensive plan. No later than January 15, 1968, the board shall have developed and adopted a comprehensive plan of courses of study to be provided and offered in the El Pase AT PIKES PEAK community college, which plan shall be approved by the Colorado commission on higher education. No later than November 15, 1968, the board shall adopt a comprehensive plan for the projected development of a campus for said college, to open in the fall of 1969. In addition, the plan shall include an estimate of projected capital costs and operating expenses for a period of five years. In developing campus plans and projected capital costs and operating expenses, the board shall consult with the appropriate state planning authority and the Colorado commission on higher education.

Section 5. 23-62-105, Colorado Revised Statutes 1973, is amended to read:

23-62-105. Board to supervise and control college. The board has the general supervision of the El Pase PIKES PEAK community college and the control and direction of the funds and appropriations made thereto and has the power to receive, demand, and hold for the uses and purposes of said community college such moneys, lands, and other properties as may be donated, devised, leased, or conveyed thereto and to apply the same in such manner as shall best serve the objects and interests of the said community college.

Section 6. 23-62-106, Colorado Revised Statutes 1973, is amended to read:

23-62-106. Power of eminent domain. The board also has the power to take and hold, by gift, devise, purchase, or lease or through the exercise of the power of eminent domain pursuant to law, so much land as may become necessary for the location and construction of buildings, structures, and other facilities as may be required for the uses and purposes of the El Paso PIKES PEAK community college.

Section 7. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
